

# Community-Based Research (CBR) Capacity Building

**CBR Training.** The [Centre for Community Based Research](#) (CCBR) offers both introductory and advanced CBR training (on-line and in-person) as well as institutes and tailored workshops designed to accelerate knowledge and skills. CBR training opportunities are offered to all those interested, including students, academic and non-academic researchers, human service providers, government employees, and other community members across Canada and internationally. The CBR training is based on the proven (and highly rated) training material developed and implemented by CCBR.

**Coaching Cadre.** CCBR draws on its extensive network to provide qualified CBR coaching support and CBR resources to faculty, students, and other research professionals who engage communities in their research projects. CCBR provides both immediate support by phone or email (i.e., question and answer) as well as on-site consultation services.

**CBR Project Assessments.** CCBR provides reviews for specific CBR projects using CBR indicators of excellence. Research projects and proposals will be assessed, and recommendations made, according to the categories of relevance, rigour and impact. The research project assessments are intended for academic and community researchers who wish to ensure that their research projects are distinctively “community-based”.

**CBR Ethics Support.** CCBR offers ethics support through the [Community Research Ethics Office](#) (CREO). CREO follows the Tri-Council guidelines in conducting full ethics reviews of proposed research projects (TCPS 2, 2014). CREO will also provide one-on-one consultations and training workshops on the ethical conduct of research.



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
